I am so pleased to let you know that **we expect to further lower taxes this year**. Our citizen Treasurer and Finance Committee have studied the budget being proposed to council and recommended its approval along with a lower millage rate that supports it. Our annexations and careful management have made this possible in spite of the fact that there was very little change in property values between 2012 and 2013. We'll hold public hearings at the council meetings on Thursday, May 16 and Tuesday, June 18. Note that the June meeting is not on the regular third Thursday date as some of our council members will be unable to attend that day.

Our contractors for the **dam reconstruction** are planning to remobilize next week if the weather cooperates. Bob Smith, Tom Rozier, and I will be meeting with them and all our engineers on Wednesday about this. Let's all hope that when they get that heavy equipment back on the slope of the dam, the earth is dry enough for them to complete the remaining work in a minimum amount of time. We will all be so glad to see this finished! The rains, although delaying completion, have brought us a lot of water back into the lake – it's now about one-third full. We're glad to get a jump on that before the dry days of summer come.
