Remember our city's Earth Day on Saturday, April 23 from 10 AM - 2 PM. Please go first to the Chapel parking lot where Jill Rice and Tracey Settlage have committed again to sponsor the shredder truck. Many thanks to them! There you will also find a truck from Fully Furnished Ministries, a faith-based furniture bank run by volunteers who collect and deliver furniture to veterans needing housing, women fleeing abuse, refugees, hurricane and fire victims, and others who need help. If you have any furniture or household goods that could help someone, please offer it to these folks before moving on to our City Hall parking lot where you will find our own Waste Management guys waiting for "big trash" and a metal recycling guy. We will also be collecting towels or washcloths and flat sheets,



not fitted ones, for animal shelters. These need to be clean and have no holes, fringe



or strings which can choke some of the animals. If you have American **flags** that are worn or faded, you can leave those with me, and I will get them to a Scout troop that will respectfully retire them with honor. I appreciate the Chapel opening their parking lot for us and remind you all that **someone will check**

They will not be taking yard trash, paint cans or chemical liquids, construction debris, propane tanks, tires, or large metal appliances and poles. Also, nothing that contains lithium batteries, is combustible, or anything over 8 feet long. That won't fit in the truck.

I need to share a little information about **city rights-of-way** because most of us don't know about them or fully understand. We normally think of our front yard as extending to the street, but if you look at your plat or property survey you will see that there's an area along the streets that belongs to the city. That's necessary for us to maintain streets, traffic signs, stormwater infrastructure, power and communication lines, etc. People have the right to park in front of your house on the On that same Saturday there will also be a plant sale and a Red Cross Blood Drive at the Chapel. ROW, although overnight parking there is not allowed for anyone. The city has ordinances that control signage, so if you need to put a sign in front of your house, please be sure that it is at least 10 feet back from the edge of the pavement. We understand that some of the older streets in the city have kind of wonky rights-of-way, so if you can show the City Marshal a certified survey showing your property to be closer than 10 feet from the edge of the pavement, we will, of course, honor that. We are just using 10 feet as a rule of thumb to help everybody figure this out as best we can.
