I am very excited to introduce you to our newest City Marshal, Marty Bozeman. He brings 36 years of law enforcement experience to Berkeley Lake and in his spare time enjoys gardening, birding and nature photography. Marty grew up in Chamblee, and served as a Lieutenant for the Chamblee Police, a Major for the Henry County Police, and a criminal investigator for the Locust Grove Police. He also served 19 years with the state of Georgia and was the Chief Investigator of the Georgia Department of Transportation's criminal investigations unit. Before coming to Berkeley Lake, he worked part-time as a campus police officer for the University of North Georgia. Please introduce yourself to Marty when you see him out on his rounds. I think you will enjoy getting to know him.

Our city works hard to keep the big picture in mind and to plan ahead, rather than just react to things as they pop up. To do that proactively we have meetings with community leaders every few years to reconsider what we've accomplished and what needs doing. We meet with these citizen leaders to solicit their input and suggestions which are then considered by our City Council in preparing or refining a **Comprehensive Plan**. This is used to guide our city into the next few years with clarified goals and

measurable outcomes. This process will be led by what we are calling a Steering Committee. I have asked the president of every homeowner association in our city to serve on this group or to designate someone in their place. Having invited those neighborhood leaders, I have also invited the presidents of the BLOSOMS, the Chapel, a Berkeley Lake business owner, a representative of the local economic development community, as well as two members of our Planning and Zoning Commission, and one

representative from our City Council. We can all appreciate these already very busy leaders who are making time to work on this, and I will, of course, keep you apprised of their progress.

I recently received a letter from the Arbor Day foundation, congratulating Berkeley Lake on winning the **Tree City** award again. They go on to say: "Over the last few years the value and importance of trees has become increasingly clear. Cities and towns across the globe are facing issues with air quality, water resources, personal health and well-being, and energy use.



Berkeley Lake has taken steps to create a brighter, greener future." As always, we are indebted to our **Berkeley Lake Conservancy led by Susan Hanson** in our tree projects.

A **rabid raccoon was recently found in Buford**, and I wanted to share the following tips from Elliott Brack of the Gwinnett Forum to protect yourself and your family from rabies:

- Make sure your pets get their rabies shots regularly.
- Keep your pets on your property.
- Do not leave garbage or pet food outside. Food left out may attract wild or stray animals.
- Report any animal acting unusually to Gwinnett County Animal Welfare and Enforcement at 770-339-3200. They may display strange or unusual behavior. They may also act aggressively, avoid food and water, foam at the mouth, have trouble moving or move in a stiff, odd way. Stay away from any unknown animals, especially wildlife.

I have for many years really worried about the possibility of a **train derailment** near us. A lot of freight moves daily just above our lake and the Chattahoochee, and some of it is scary stuff. I recently sent a letter to members of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives which said in part: "The unfortunate derailment and environmental contamination in East Palestine, Ohio is not unprecedented. There are more than 1,000 trains derailing each year in multiple states." I urged them to "act now on rail safety." I also asked our City Marshal, Rob Hiller, to study the topography between us and the railroad track and be prepared to help us react in the quickest and most protective way possible in the event of an accident. Rob has some valuable experience and training with hazardous materials and would be a very good resource for us if necessary. I certainly hope it never is.
