Advance in-person voting will be available in City Hall from 9 AM until 5 PM on the following dates: October 16-21, October 23-28, and October 30 through November 3. On November 7 the polls will be open in City Hall from 7 AM until 7 PM. If you need to register to vote in this election, you need to do that on or before October 10. Our city website shows a sample ballot (seen here) to help you make your choices for voting. Check out the Secretary of State's website for information regarding acceptable forms of photo ID, and be sure to take photo ID with you when you go to vote.

Citizens will have an opportunity to hear from the candidates at a Candidate Forum on Wednesday, October 11 at 7 PM at the Lake Berkeley Chapel. While thinking of gardens, I want also to share that the Gwinnett Tech horticulture department is having their fall sale of student grown plants on October 17-19 from 9 AM to 4 PM. You will find cool season veggies, annuals, trees and shrubs, perennials, and houseplants.

With fall coming up, I want to remind everybody please not to rake or blow **leaves and other yard debris** into our drainage ditches and roadways which results in clogged storm drains and possible flooding and property damage. If the leaves do make it through the storm drains, they flow into our streams and lake, which is not a good thing either. You may want to blow leaves and yard debris into natural areas under shrubs and trees in the woods on your property, because they make good mulch, holding moisture for growing plants and preventing soil erosion. Otherwise, please bag your yard debris and set it out for collection and disposal by Waste Management.

As most of you know, about this time every year I send out a call for volunteers who might be willing to serve on any of our **city's committees** in the coming year. If you are interested in serving on the Berkeley Lake Conservancy, the Planning and Zoning Commission, the citizens' Finance Committee, the Park Committee, or the Arts Committee, please let me know. There may be an opening coming up if some of our current folks roll off. The involvement of people who are so generous in volunteering their time is one of the major strengths of our city. There is information about committees on our city's website and I will be happy to discuss options for committee work with any interested citizens. I will be making appointments to committees as usual at the first City Council meeting in January.




October is **Breast Cancer Awareness Month** and **mammogram** appointments at the hospital often fill up quickly. There will be a mobile mammography unit at 1755 N. Brown Rd. in Lawrenceville near Sugarloaf Mills on October 10. You will need to preregister for an appointment time and submit a physician's order requesting the mammogram. I have been asked by the Gwinnett Municipal Association to share some information from Dr. Audrey Arona, who leads our **regional public health** authority. Re COVID-19, the good news is that the majority of the U.S. population has some level of immunity due to infection, vaccination or both. Because immunity wanes over time, coupled with emerging new variants, she highly encourages individuals to receive the recently-approved, newest monovalent COVID-19 vaccine. This vaccine was

recently approved by the FDA, the CDC-ACIP Committee and the CDC Director and is considered highly safe. It is anticipated to benefit all age groups, including the age group for which there is a small risk of myocarditis, and may be given at the same time as any other adult or pediatric vaccine including influenza and/or RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus). She says anyone over the age of 65 should consider getting the high-dose flu vaccine. Check out any old at-home COVID tests for expiration and other information here.
